


Benefits, Tools, and Tips



Simulations turn history into active decision-making and evidence use.






Practical Ways to Use AI Chatbots in the History Class

Skills	How to Use	Example
Engage critically	Treat chatbot replies as claims to test; check assumptions and gaps.	After "Napoleon" chat, list 2 supported claims, 1 uncertainty, 1 question.
Push Arguments	Prompt bot for reasons and counterarguments to weigh evidence.	On French Revolution causes, rate 2 reasons, 1 counterclaim, add evidence.
Compare with textbook info	Align chatbot statements with textbook/primary sources and mark accuracy.	Copy 3 claims, match with page numbers, mark supported/partially/not.
Fact-check with credible sources	Use archives, databases, or journals to verify chatbot claims.	Pick 1 claim, find source, cite it, and write a 1- sentence accuracy check.

AI Tools



When it comes to tools, I've kept the list short and focused. Rather than overwhelming you with every chatbot out there, I limited my choices to just a few that I've tested myself.

These are the ones I've found reliable, teacher-friendly, and adaptable for history lessons.




AI Tools

AI Tool	How to Use	Example
Custom GPT in ChatGPT	Build a Historical Chatbot with vetted excerpts and clear instructions.	Seed prompt: "You are a Grade 8 historian. Answer in 120 words, cite 1 source."
SchoolAI Spaces	Teacher-controlled chat space with personas, guiding questions, and scaffolds.	Run a 5-min "historical interview," then export transcript for source check.
Humy Al	Ready-made historical personas for quick role- plays or warm-ups.	Ask Frederick Douglass 2 questions on abolition, screenshot 1 claim to verify.
Hello History	Mobile app for station work or BYOD settings.	Short chat with a figure, add 1 corroborating reference and 1 accuracy verdict.



Teacher Tip Always require students to verify chatbot claims with at least one non-AI source. Example: textbook page, archive doc, or museum site.
